



Although one of the great episodes of all time, much of the story of World War I is little known today and the history of Jewish involvement in the global struggle is even less familiar. In this sweeping presentation, the general course of the war and the role Jews played on both sides will be highlighted. From the founding of the Jewish Mule Corps to the Balfour Declaration to the British victory in the land of Israel, we will explore in a “day by day” fashion the remarkable epoch, which ironically came to be known as the War to End All Wars.

Rabbi Earl Bowen of Congregation Beth El in West Oak Lane will discuss the synagogue's history and the role African American Jews play in Jewish and minority social and political arena.

The Lewis and Clark Expedition (1803-1806) – Discovering the American West

Speaker: John W. Jengo, Geologist and environmental consultant

Author Kathryn Lasky said: "I think the Lewis and Clark Expedition was the greatest undertaking in American history. I think landing a man on the moon pales next to it." This presentation will try to answer why this may be so and will review the preparation, the 2.5-year journey to the Pacific Ocean and back, and numerous achievements and discoveries of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Led by Captains Meriwether Lewis and William Clark, the expedition explored the Louisiana Purchase and the Pacific Northwest between 1804-1806, which is still considered to be the greatest chapter in the annals of American exploration.
